- Includes reviewed technical articles, calls for papers and participation, surveys, announcements, new Ph.D. abstracts, job postings.
 - Formerly as the SIGSAM Bulletin (1967 − 2004) and SIGSIC Bulletin (1965 − 1967)
- CCA is (almost) up-to-date and publish 4 issues per year in their listed month of issue.
- Switched to printing only 2 double-issues per year, 4 issues electronically. This has been very cost-effective

The "ACM Transactions on Mathematical Software" (TOMS) seeks to communicate important research results addressing the development, evaluation and use of mathematical software.

- TOMS publishes machine-readable computer software which is incorporated into the "Collected Algorithms of the ACM."
- SIGSAM holds a seat on the TOMS editorial board (currently Gene Cooperman) and encourages submissions of computer algebra papers to TOMS.
